

Fayette Park Site Chosen For Memorial

Columbus Monument Location Decided by City Officials

The Columbus monument, a tribute of Italian citizenry of Syracuse to the memory of the great discoverer, will be erected in Fayette park, according to decision reached yesterday in a long conference of Mayor Marvin, Clarence E. Howard, consultant of the planning, parks and recreation commission, and John W. Barnell, chairman of the memorial committee.

The funds are available, a model of the memorial has been placed before the commission and the only question that has bothered sponsors and city officials was the place it should be located. St. Mary's circle, Onondaga, Columbus and Fayette parks were the principal sites suggested but agreement was finally reached that Fayette park furnished the place if the memorial could be erected without changing the character of the park or interfering in any way with the Hamilton White monument now there.

Captain Howard had with his maps showing proposed rearrangement of the park to provide for the memorial without interfering in any way with its original purpose or its capacity and Mayor Marvin gave his consent to the erection there.
