

Columbus Statue Decision May Be Reached Today

Tall Monument Expected to Be Chosen

The committee of eight from Syracuse university trying to decide what monument should be selected for the Columbus Monument association to place in Onondaga park couldn't reach a decision yesterday.

They deliberated for an hour and a half, then announced that this morning a conference will be held with the sculptors now in Syracuse. A decision is expected at that time.

The 14 models on exhibition on the eleventh floor of the Onondaga were again scrutinized yesterday and from comments made it was judged that the monument selected will be of the tall, slender type.

It was pointed out that inasmuch as the monument will be erected on Round Top in the park, statuary that will be visible for a considerable distance is desirable. The models which embodied this idea were given most attention.

John G. Ciccarelli, president of the association, and John W. Barnell, chairman of the building committee, conferred with members of the committee yesterday regarding the selection. They will meet again with them this morning.
