
Widow of White Must Pass Upon Monument Plans

Present Statue May Be Moved

While the Italian citizens are desirous of locating their Columbus memorial in Fayette park and Mayor Marvin and the planning parks and recreation commission are anxious to co-operate with them, it developed yesterday the final word rests with Mrs. Hamilton White, widow of the man whose monument now adorns the space.

Tentative plans that otherwise meet approval of officialdom will be revised if Mrs. White objects to removal of the monument to her husband. These plans call for a relocation of the White memorial at the eastern end of the park, facing the former Hamilton S. White home, now the property of the Ka-Na-Te-Nah club.

Certain of the city planners believe such a location would be more appropriate for the White monument than its present location at the western end of the park. They have in mind beautification of both ends of the park if decision is reached to have the two monuments there, with the larger Columbus memorial in approximately the place now occupied by the other.
