

Primo Carnera to Box Two Foes for 6 Rounds At Arena Friday Night



PRIMO CARNERA

Great Champion of Boxing World to Show Wares Here—Nelson Scores Quick Knockout Over George Courtney

Members of the Disabled War Veterans boxing committee and Match-maker Bill Shaw were today busy lining up their second boxing card of the week, arrangements having been completed to show Primo Carnera, heavy-weight champion of the world, at the Arena Friday night.

Announcement was made from the ring at the weekly show staged in the South Salina Street drilled last night that the huge Italian titleholder would mingle with two opponents, taking on each boxer over the three-round route. Carnera's appearance at the Central New York boxing club was made possible through the efforts of Commissioner Walker D. Wear of Binghamton and officials of the Columbus Monument Association, the champion being scheduled to assist in the unvelving ceremonies at old St. Marys Circle before donning the gloves for his fistic drills.

The regular weekly card last night

was rather a sensational one, with a two-minute knockout in the first round of the main bout between Johnny Nelson, Syracuse negro, and George Courtney, Oklahoma, bringing the hostilities to rather a dramatic close.

Courtney was the ringster counted out, and to the fans who watched the

colorful Westerner in action with Frank Moody here several years ago, the kayo punch brought many a round of regret.

The boy who flashed out of the western ranch lands a few years ago to blaze his way into the front ranks of the middleweight division, looked
