

Oppose Park As Columbus Memorial Site

Strathmore Improvers to Fight Onondaga Proposal

The Strathmore Improvement Association will oppose the proposal to place the new Columbus monument in Onondaga Park.

A committee headed by Dr. John J. Buettner and including Herbert M. Osborne, former city comptroller, and Mrs. Edward C. Hughes has been appointed by Raymond M. King, president of the association, to receive protests against the plan.

The committee was appointed last night at the annual dinner dance of the association at Drumlins. The discussion revealed that there is some division of opinion among the members on the proposal to place the monument in Onondaga Park.

The committee will be known as the parks committee and protests must be filed with the chairman within two weeks. The protests will take the form of a petition, which will be presented to the city parks and planning commission, according to Paul Androus, secretary.

During last night's discussion, which was attended by 200 persons, two alternatives for the monument were proposed. Columbus or Westminster Parks were suggested but no definite action was taken on either proposal.
