

Site Hunt on For Memorial To Columbus

Survey Reports Are to Be Checked at Meeting on Wednesday

Reports on the survey of possible sites for the new Columbus monument are expected to be filed with the Planning, Parks and Recreation Commission at its meeting on Wednesday.

The Fayette Park project involved relocating the White monument in the east end of the park, with the Columbus monument at the west end.

As a compromise, the commission recommended the center of Fayette Park but it was rejected by the Columbus Memorial Association, Inc., which is making the monument possible.

Several new sites have been suggested and the commission is expected to attempt a crystallization of sentiment on one at Wednesday's meeting.

The commission will pass upon five applications for zone changes at the meeting prior to discussing the new monument program.

The first is designed to change the northeast corner of East Genesee Street and Walnut Avenue from B residential to local business A; a second would change the southeast corner of James Street and Clifton Place from A to B residential; under a third the southwest corner of Cheung Street and Milton Avenue would be changed from B residential to local business A.

A fourth would change the zoning of the southeast corner of Hiawatha Boulevard and Solar Street from industrial to local business B, and the fifth is designed to change the northeast corner of South West and Fabius Streets from commercial to local business B.
