# Weather Holds Up Columbus Memorial Material on Canal

The Columbus monument material on board barges bound for Syracuse remained at Sylvan Beach today, due to weather conditions and the consequent emergency in the Barge Canal system.

It was indicated today that the tug Syracuse, now towing a dredge from Lyons to the Syracuse terminal, will be dispatched to tow in the 153 tons of granite for the memorial to be erected this winter in St. Marks Circle.

The Governor Roosevelt, the tug which towed the barges from New York to Onondaga Lake, had to be sent back through the Mohawk River for ice-breaking work. The tug National was substituted to tow in the barges, but in view of dangerous conditions on the lake it was decided that the National must be kept there to help other shipping out of possible trouble.
