

Columbus Monument Ready For Dedication October 12

Bronze Plaque Finally Put in Place After Delay in Arrival From Italy

With the bronze plaque, whose arrival from Italy had been delayed, put in place, the Columbus monument in St. Marys Circle, today was ready for the dedication on Oct. 12, Columbus Day.

The plaque, picturing the Spanish galleons of Columbus as they sailed an unknown sea, was placed on the north side of the monument yesterday.

The statue of Columbus on the monument faces the west and on that side is the inscription on the stone, "Erected by the Citizens of Italian Origin in Onondaga County." It also carries the dates, "1492-1932," the latter the year the monument was dedicated.

A plaque on the west side of the monument pictures the return of Columbus and the presentation of American Indians at Court.

On the south side is a plaque

showing the departure of Columbus and the one on the east shows him landing at San Salvador on Oct. 12, 1492.
